The Senegal-America Project

The Senegal-America Project has two components. The first is the exchange of performing artists from both countries. Several tours have already happened with artists coming here and with our artists traveling there for performances.

The second component, The Senegal America Project Trips provide professional development for artists, educators and parents and a separate cultural educational exchange for students. Approximately \$40,000 has been donated by our travelers to help the Senegalese students and families. AAE, Inc. oversees all the donations.
